

Hymnus FG - Write A Tune In Your Wordprocessor

The symbol font "Hymnus FG" allows you to write simple tunes in your wordprocessor without the hassle of using a special software and importing the result to your text document. There are limits, of course, there is only one voice in a staff and no phrasing, crescendo etc.

Hymnus FG has eighth, quarter, half, whole and breve notes (quavers, crotchets, minims, semibreves and breves) in the typical singable range from h to e". Spacing is done with empty staff (on the hyphen key).

Besides, the font contains crotchets and minims without stems as well as semibreves with vertical lines to the left and right for liturgical singing. And, of course, keys, accidentals and punctuation. The Windows character map or the insert special character feature of your wordprocessor will help you.
